
Ice Cream Social, February 16th, at St. Matthew's

Ash Wednesday Service on February 26th at 5:30 p.m.





Ash Wednesday marks the beginning of Lent, the season of spiritual preparation for Easter. Lent is 40 days long because Jesus spent 40 days in the wilderness at the beginning of his ministry (see Matthew 4:1-11). Traditionally, Lent has been a solemn season seeking to deepen our relationship with God through prayer, self-examination, self-denial, and studying God's Word.

Those who look closely at the calendar will say, "But there are 46 days from Ash Wednesday to Easter!" That's because the Sundays during Lent are *not* part of Lent. The early Christian movement saw every Sunday as a "little" Easter Sunday. So from their perspective, the celebration of Easter was stronger than the solemnness and fasting of Lent. As a result, the Sundays during Lent are *not* counted as part of the Lenten Season. This way Sunday remains a day of celebration.

Praying for Jennifer is about a teenager named Jennifer who is in a very serious auto accident and not expected to live. A nurse tells Jennifer's teenage friends that the only thing they can do to help Jennifer is pray. So even though most of the teens are not religious, they pray. Jennifer makes an amazing recovery. But then at a certain point, no matter how hard her friends continuing praying, Jennifer seems to stop making progress. So, the teens begin asking people questions to explain why their prayers were answered at first and then seemed to stop working. Most of the book is about the various answers people give the teens.






