
Lenten Study Starts Thursday, March 5th

This year St. Matthew's is going to read *Praying for Jennifer* by John Cobb for its Lenten Study. The Lenten class will meet for 4 weeks from 10:30 am 12 Noon starting on Thursday, March 5. The study will end on March 26.

Praying for Jennifer is about a teenager named Jennifer who is in a very serious auto accident and not expected to live. A nurse tells Jennifer's teenage friends that the only thing they can do to help Jennifer is pray. So even though most of the teens are not religious, they pray. Jennifer makes an amazing recovery. But then at a certain point, no matter how hard her friends continuing praying, Jennifer seems to stop making progress. So, the teens begin asking people questions to explain why their prayers were answered at first and then seemed to stop working. Most of the book is about the various answers people give the teens.

Celebrate the Seder (Passover) Meal on Sunday Morning, March 22

St. Matthew's UMC is joining with Blessed Chinese UMC to recreate the Seder (Passover) meal during 10 am Sunday morning worship on March 22. When Jesus gathered with his disciples in the Upper Room to share a meal which became communion, they were probably celebrating the Jewish Seder (Passover) meal. Many who have taken part in the Seder Service talk about how it deepened their faith and changed their experience of communion.


Instead of meeting in the Sanctuary, the two congregations will meet together in the Fellowship Hall at 10 am. Unlike communion which is a symbolic meal, the Seder Meal includes a full meal. Traditionally, it is a feast with lots of family and friends. So, on March 22nd the combined Sunday morning worship service will include lunch. The Feulner's are coordinating St. Matthew's part of the meal. And, the people of Blessed Chinese are preparing the other part of the meal.

The Seder Meal includes a number of special foods. They help people remember the events the Jewish people experienced as God led out of slavery in Egypt towards freedom in the promised land. These include:

- charoset (a mortar of chopped apples, nuts & cinnamon) to recall the mortar the Jewish people used as slaves as they built for the Egyptians
- bitter herbs to remember their tears
- unleavened bread (matzoh) as a reminder of how they had to pick up and go on a moment's notice when God set them free.

The Seder Meal is multi-generational. It includes special roles and games for children. And as it sometimes happens, if the youngest person present is 77, then this person takes on the special role of the child during the service.

There will be a sign-up sheet in the Sanctuary and church office. Invite your family and friends to come and share in this unique worship service.



Palm Sunday, Holy Week and Easter - April 5 to 12




Palm Sunday, April 5 – There will be a procession of the Palms to remember Jesus' entrance into Jerusalem at the beginning of Holy Week. In addition, the sanctuary will be decorated with Palms. The service will end with a dramatic reading of the Passion Story from the Bible. Because the Seder Meal on March 22nd includes communion, there will *not* be communion on Palm Sunday.



Good Friday, April 10 – There will be a Prayer Vigil from 10 am to 2 pm. People can sign up to pray for 15 minutes (or longer) either in the Sanctuary or at home. Then, at 7 pm there will be a Good Friday service that includes a choir cantata.



Easter Sunday, April 12 – The Easter Cross will be on the front lawn for people to cover with flowers as they come to worship. At the 10 am service, there will be lots of special music from the Chancel Choir and the Bell Choir. The 10 am service will end outside with the congregation singing around the Easter Cross.
