Online Good Friday Service at 7:00 pm on April 10th

St. Matthew's is having a Good Friday service at 7:00 pm on Friday, April 10th. The service is built around a series of dramatic readings of the passion story using Mark's gospel as a guide. There will also be pictures to enhance the readings. In addition, we will sing several hymns, candles will be extinguished and the sanctuary will be gradually darkened.

Join Together for the Good Friday Prayer Vigil on April 10th

There will be a Good Friday Prayer Vigil from 12 noon to 2:00 pm on April 10th. People are invited to pray at home for 10-15 minutes or longer anytime between 12 noon and 2 pm. (The Sanctuary will *not* be used.)

People taking part in the Prayer Vigil can pray in a variety of ways including:

- focusing on particular prayer concerns in their hearts
- praying for our world and its people as we live through the Corona Virus pandemic
- giving thanks for God's work in our world
- lifting up people who are included on the church's regular weekly prayer list
- requesting God's guidance for our church, our nation, our world
- using a hymn or written prayer to steer one's prayer time
- just sitting quietly in God's presence

Use the resources you have at home. This may include a hymnal, *Upper Rooms*, favorite written prayers, reading scripture passages, Some may wish to use a newspaper or other news source to guide you as you pray for our community and the world during this time.

Here is a suggested prayer for our world as people everywhere struggle with the COVID-19. Please pray for:

- those who are ill or have died with COVID-19 and their loved ones
- doctors, nurses, paramedics, first responders who are putting themselves in harms way to save the lives of others
- those at risk, including those with compromised immune systems and over 65
- folks who are running errands and getting provisions for people at risk so that they can stay safely at home
- people without work or reduced hours during this time
- governmental officials to provide leadership and make wise decisions
- researchers who are working to find medicines and treatments that are effective
- workers providing food, supplies, protective equipment, power, water, . . . that we need to live through this time
- people in our communities to work together to help one another through this time
- others whom we name in our hearts



Celebrating Easter Differently



This year we will celebrate Easter several different times. These include:

- Celebrating Easter Sunday on its traditional date April 12 with an online worship service.
- Celebrating Easter Sunday with a "traditional" Easter service shortly after we resume in person worship in the sanctuary. St. Matt's Church Council Is Guiding the Church Family Through this Rapidly Changing Time

The Church Council has met 3 times during the last month to guide St. Matthew's through this rapidly changing time. Under the Council's leadership the following has happened:

- St. Matthew's has started worshipping online.
- St. Matthew's now has a way for people to make online contributions.
- People can now drop their gifts by the church using the secured lock box on the office door.
- The church has a "new" redesigned web page.
- The congregation has a new 2020 directory
- The congregation including fellowship groups and church

committees – and preschool have new ways to gather, stay connected and continue working together.

The Church Council is the place where all of the church's leadership come together to provide overall guidance for the church. It includes leadership from all of the church's committees plus additional folks to help round out its membership. The Church Council began meeting regularly last December under the leadership of Marilyn Matthews to provide better overall leadership to the St. Matthew's church family.

SPRC, Finance and Trustees continue meeting regularly to help guide the church through this time. They are coordinating their work through the Church Council.



Online Worship Begins at St. Matthew's



St. Matthew's continues to worship together each week, just differently. In response to "Safer at Home", St. Matthew's began having online worship services on March 15th using Facebook live.

The service officially begins at 10:00 am. But many are coming 5 minutes early – at 9:55 am – for an extended prelude. (Note: change to 5 minutes early from 10 minutes early.) Others join the service later during the week using the recording that's available both through St. Matthew's "new" website and on the church's Facebook page.

Each week, there are slides showing the words of the hymns so people can sing at home. (And, many folks report that they are!) There is lots of special music including a solo and an extended prelude. We pray together. The Bible is read and Pastor Richard shares a message based on the Bible reading. The service ends with St. Matthew's "traditional" sung benediction song, *The Lord Bless and Keep You.*

An unexpected surprise of doing online worship is how many people have come! Each week at least 300 – and sometimes more than 500 – people are joining together for the worship at St. Matthew's. Many shut-ins in the church family are now enjoying coming to church each week. The church is also receiving positive, encouraging comments from around the country including places such as Minnesota, Tennessee and Utah. Some are from people in the extended church family. Others are from folks who are connected in many different ways with the church family. If you're on Facebook, you can help spread the word. Consider sharing the link to each week's worship service on your Facebook page.

Some thought online worship couldn't be done. But where there is a will, there is a way. Each week, the service continues to happen online. People's words of encouragement are greatly appreciated. So are the many helpful suggestions on ways to strengthen the service.

Wednesday Worship Continues at the Palms

People are gathering for the service through a group telephone call since many residents of the Palms do not use the internet. The service has been adapted to work better using the phone. There is a time of sharing, followed by special music from Johnny Doyle. The Bible is read and Pastor Richard shares a short mediation. The service ends with prayer.

Where We Stand With Stewardship: A Note from Finance

Hello Friends,

I hope you are all doing well. I also hope you are social distancing and regularly washing your hands because I want to see you all back in worship when we can start attending worship services in the Sanctuary again.

I want to bring you up to speed on our 2020 pledge campaign. We received 43 pledges in 2020 compared to 37 in 2019. 3 of the 43 pledges received are from people who have not pledged before or are new to giving to St. Matthew's. Plus, there are several families who started giving to St. Matthew's who haven't been giving for awhile. The average increase in individual pledges this year is 9% over what was given in 2019.

We estimate giving for the congregation as a whole in 2020 to be just over \$210,000. However, this could change because of the corona virus.

Some may not have pledged yet. That's OK. People can still pledge by mailing your pledge card in to the church office. If you don't have a pledge card, you can call the church office so that one can be mailed out to you. You can send the pledge card to:

St. Matthew's Preschool Keeps on Helping Children!



There have been substantial changes in how we operate the preschool over the past month due to the risks and restrictions placed on everyone due to the Corona virus. Because of the "Safer at Home" order, March 13th was the last day we physically had the preschool facility open and operating. However, this has not precluded us from continuing to provide services to our families.

We started off the week of March 16th by introducing an online learning program for our students. The initial program consisted of materials being emailed to our parents every other day. This included academic worksheets, thematic crafts and activities and links to music and movement

songs. At the end of the first week, Pastor Richard added to the online learning curriculum by filming children's chapel and putting it to the preschool's Facebook page.

The week of March 23rd began with a new and exciting aspect of online learning. On that Wednesday, the teachers began a virtual learning program with their students using the church's zoom account. The teachers and their children are logging in every day during the week and meeting face to face. They are able to do circle time, worksheets, songs and activities virtually with their class!

It has been an amazing experience that has allowed our teachers and students to continue to connect on an academic and social level even as they are not able to physically connect with one another. We greatly look forward to being able to reopen the preschool once it is safe for the staff and students to do so. But until then, we will continue to reach out to our families in alternative ways in order to maintain our promise of academic, social and spiritual learning.

St. Matthew's response to the Coronavirus has been decisive and swift. Under Pastor's leadership, St. Matthew's has aggressively deployed the power of the Internet to:

- Continue Sunday services along with our music program
- Maintain connections with our extended and now expanding Church family
- Maintain oversight of our Church administrative functions such as Finances and Trustees
- Continue some of our social groups such as the Women's and Men's breakfasts.
- Extend our reach into the homes of our Preschool children and families with daily online learning sessions.

We have all experienced the positive effects of these efforts as St. Matthew's demonstrates our ability to promptly react to new challenges while following social distancing directives.

Still, for the foreseeable future and like other churches, St. Matthew's faces basic monthly expenses to keep the Church open and serving the community. While many churches might crumble, Pastor Richard announces, amid his tireless efforts, he and Ruth will be donating 1/4 of his salary back to St. Matthew's each pay period for the next three months. This gift is part of the foundation which allows St. Matthew's to keep all of its staff in place. While many have reduced hours, none have been laid off.

The Bible says, "For where your treasure is, there your heart will be also." (Matthew 6:21). Please prayerfully consider how you can sustain our Church as an enduring presence in our community, rising to meet the financial threat that is facing our Church today.




