#### **Matching Gift Challenge a Great Success!**

Dear Church Family,

As most of you know, a generous member has offered St. Matthew's a matching dollar for dollar grant challenge to pay for some much needed projects around the St. Matthew's campus. The grant is for up to \$15,000, which means that for every dollar members of St. Matthew's raise, the member will match the amount up to \$15,000. As of today, we have exceeded our goal by raising \$17,546. The money was raised well ahead of our mid-June deadline. We, St. Matthew's members, have brought about this awesome feat in just a few short weeks.

Funds raised will be used to replace the office roof and make repairs to the preschool playground equipment. With the money we have so far we are ready to start the roof replacement project. Look for that project to start very soon. Progress has also been made on the modification to the playground equipment. We have met with and secured a contractor to do the work. The contractor has also agreed to meet with our inspector before beginning the work to make sure all work done is to state code. So that project should be starting soon as well.

# Weekly Worship Happens Each Week at St. Matthew's

Worship at St. Matthew's has never stopped!! It's just happening in different ways.

St. Matthew's began offering online worship in mid-March. An unexpected surprise is how many people now come – sometimes a service has more than 500 views!! Church family shut-ins – some who haven't been able to attend in years – now enjoy coming to church each week. Others are pleased that family members who live far away can regularly come to worship with them. Members of the extended church family – some in Hacienda Heights but many scattered around the country – are able to come more often. The church has received encouraging comments from a variety of places such as Minnesota, Tennessee, Utah and most recently Africa.

Now, St. Matthew's is exploring how to resume in person worship while continuing to offer online worship. Some in the church family long to gather together as soon as possible. Others do not yet feel safe in group gatherings. Some even have family who don't want them to leave the house for anything. Whatever St. Matthew's does next, we will need to offer worship in ways that meet the differing needs of our church family.

In addition, there are requirements which St. Matthew's must follow in order to resume in person worship. But, just as important as any requirement is following Jesus' commandment to love our neighbor as ourselves. The Church Council has established a task force to develop a plan that follows the many different requirements. Once this plan is developed, it needs to be approved by groups within our church and also by our district superintendent. So, it may be a while before in person worship resumes – possibly not until the end of June or later. Members of the task force are Mike Gallagher, Olga Baker, Bob Hernandez, Marilyn Matthews, Elaine Ono, Sherry Morales and Pastor Richard. Please pray for them.

Since online worship will continue even after in person worship resumes, St. Matthew's is beginning to invest in equipment to strengthen our online worship capabilities. This includes upgrading from the smart phone we're using to a web camera. But, its hard to find a web camera because so many other churches have also started online worship. Other online worship improvements are also in the works. Many thanks to our tech crew – Morgan Matthews, Ruth Hutchison and Jack Weatherford with help from many others – for providing the foundations that make online worship possible each week.

In the midst of all of this, worship keeps happening every week. The service officially begins at 10:00 am. But, many come 5 minutes early – at 9:55 am – for the extended prelude. Others join the service during the week through the recording which remains available. Each week there are slides with the words of the hymns so people can sing at home. (And, many folks report that they are singing!) There is lots of special music including a solo and the extended prelude. We pray together. The Bible is read. Pastor Richard shares a message. The service ends with St. Matthew's "traditional" sung benediction song, *The Lord Bless and Keep You*.


# The Church Council Is Guiding the Church Family Through this Rapidly Changing Time

The Church Council is meeting regularly to guide St. Matthew's through this rapidly changing time. Under the Council's leadership the church is/has:

- developing a way to resume in person worship. In order to do this safely, much thoughtful
  work is needed to bring together what needs to be done in many different critical areas.
- secured an SBA/PPP (Paycheck Protection Program) loan that can become a grant. This is allowing the church to bring back staff, especially in the Preschool.
- expanded the number of church groups that can gather. Top-of-the-Hill and Adult Sunday School have joined the Women's and Men's Fellowship groups in meeting through zoom.
- further strengthening online worship and taking steps so online worship will continue even after in person worship resumes.
- keeping the Trustees updated so they can begin office roof repairs and preschool play ground repairs quickly as funds became available through the Matching Gift Challenge
- making improvements to the church's "new" redesigned web page. As people use the website more, lots of feedback is coming back on how to further strengthen the site.

The Church Council is the place where all of the church's leadership comes together to provide overall guidance for the church. It includes leadership from all of the church's committees plus additional folks to help round out its membership. The Church Council began meeting regularly last December under the leadership of Marilyn Matthews.

SPRC, Finance and Trustees are also meeting as needed to help guide the church through this time. They are coordinating their work through the Church Council.



# **New Bible Class Starting June 11th.**

Pastor Richard is leading a new 3 week Bible Study focusing on Acts that starts at 10:30 am on Thursday, June 11. The class will look at 3 pivotal moments in the life of the early church:

June 11 – Acts 9:1-35 about the call and emergence of a major new leader

# Annual Conference is June 18-20, But Very Differently

Each June members of the California-Pacific Annual Conference gather from 340 United Methodist Churches in Southern California, Hawaii, Guam and Saipan. But this year it will happen differently. Instead of more than 1,000 people gathering in person at the University of Redlands, more than 1,000 people will gather through a zoom webinar. Members to this year's conference from St. Matthew's are Pastor Richard Bentley, Marcie Dietrich and Chris Gallagher.

During the course of annual conference:

- people will worship together, pray for God's strength and guidance, celebrate the work of God's spirit in our midst, . . .
- new clergy will be commissioned or ordained to serve local churches and around the world
- clergy some of whom have served for more than 40 years will retire and be recognized for their years of service
- the lives of clergy, their spouses and children who have passed in the last year will be celebrated and remembered. This year among those being remembered is Elizabeth Guiterrez.
- the 2021 conference budget will be finalized for work beyond local churches. This includes providing for a bishop and district superintendent, sending delegates to the next General Conference which has been postponed to 2021, establishing new churches and revitalizing older ones, work with youth and young adults, caring for retired clergy and their spouses, . . . .
- people will be elected to serve on more than 40 different groups that provide leadership for projects and work beyond the local church
- updates will be given on how the annual conference is working with local churches to get through this challenging time.
- reports will be heard including on Resolution 19-06 about the plan being developed on what the annual conference will do if the 2021 General Conference does not disavow the Traditional Plan. (As part of the delegation, Pastor Richard will help to present this report.)
- much, much more.

But annual conference is about more than its official gatherings. People eat together with old friends and often also make new friends, run into each other going here and there, talk before and after sessions, wander among many different booths outside the Chapel, . . . . It is a mystery how some of this will happen since people won't be gathering in Redlands. But people are creative so . . . .

The delegates from St. Matthew's will bring back a report to share with St. Matthew's about what happens during the 2020 annual conference.

## Reports from the Trustees for May and June

Trustees Letter for May 2020



Dear Fellow Parishioners,

With the pandemic altering the way we celebrate our Methodist traditions, it has not changed the fact that Trustees must do our best to care for our entire campus. At this point in time, we have several focuses.

The office roof needs replaced, as the flat roof can no longer be repaired. It must be replaced with a slanted roof to better allow water run-off. There are plans to work on the preschool playground so that it adheres to California State Safety Standards.

The olive trees are nearly ready to bloom. Timing is critical in spraying the trees, to eliminate olive production and the weekly mess we always need to clean up.

The landscaping project has currently been put on hold, but it is not forgotten.

The hours of most employees have been greatly reduced. Preschool is teaching remotely, so teachers' hours have been reduced. Trash pick-up and gardeners hours have been reduced. Phone lines and internet have been reduced to cut costs.

Needless to say, our people have been affected by COVID-19, and offerings have been reduced coming into the church.

Please keep St. Matthew's in your prayers, and perhaps give some extra to help manage our church and facilities.

#### Trustees Letter for June 2020 Parishscope

#### Dear Fellow Parishioners,

With the pandemic altering the way we celebrate our Methodist traditions, it has not changed the fact that Trustees must do our best to care for our entire campus.

At this point in time, we have several focuses, which are now viable, due to your outstanding response to the Matching Grant Challenge.

The leaking office roof will be replaced with a slanted roof to better allow water run-off. Bob Hernandez has gotten bids. There is now a contractor wanting to get started.

There are imminent plans to work on the preschool playground so that it adheres to California State Safety Standards. The contractor will work with the State Playground inspector to fulfill this, so that the playground becomes usable and attending students may use it again.

The Sanctuary Chair Lift project now has enough funding to begin.

The landscaping project has currently been put on hold, but it is not forgotten.

Rodney Kurimoto's Adult Sunday School has begun Zooming, 8:45 on Sunday Mornings. Our congregation has enjoyed watching the streaming of Sunday service at 10 a.m. due to the tireless efforts by Pastor Richard, Ruth Hutchison, Elaine Ono, Pat Kunishima, and Morgan Matthews, and several other "angels" who step in as needed.

Please keep St. Matthew's in your prayers, as you are our partners who help manage and maintain our church and facilities.

# A Note from the Finance Committee for May 2020


The Finance Committee prays everyone is safe, healthy and well as we begin to emerge from our cocoons.

We want to bring you up to date with our activity in 2020. First, thanks to everyone who turned in a pledge for 2020; this really helps us to plan the year.

St. Matthew's applied for and received a CARES Act Payroll Protection Program loan of \$76,950. To the extent we use the funding for payroll and utilities costs during the specified time period (currently 8 weeks) the loan will be forgiven. Any remaining funding will be due over 2 years, starting December 2020 at 1% interest.

Your very generous giving sustains us day to day. First quarter statements were sent in April. Please let us know of any corrections we should make. So far this year 96 households have supported us financially. The majority of these gifts are by checks and cash. About 17 households have made gifts on-line.

We thank each of you for your loving support of St. Matthew's! Together we can do exciting things.



The chart above includes monies that are available for St. Matthew's for day to day operations and the planned repairs of the roof and playground.

Not included are gifts that are *not* available for St. Matthew's expenses (UMCOR \$3,793, Memorials and designated gifts \$8,485, Homeless & Hungry \$115, and Other \$1,300).
