St. Matthew's Receives Permission for Outdoor Spiritual Events



St. Matthew's has just received permission to hold outdoor spiritual events. Under the guidelines of the State of California, indoor worship is not possible at the present time for churches located in Los Angeles County. However, outdoor gatherings are possible. In addition to fulfilling state and county guidelines, St. Matthew's also had to submit a written plan for outdoor gatherings of more than 10 people for approval by United Methodist Church leadership in our area. On September 29, St. Matthew's written plan for outdoor spiritual gatherings was approved. Watch e-mails and Sunday announcements for information about upcoming events.

The approved plan allows for a variety of outdoor spiritual events in a variety of locations. It is now possible to hold outdoor gatherings of more than 10 people for:

- a Bible study
- a memorial service
- a special worship service such as Christmas Eve
- other events with a spiritual focus

These gatherings could either be:

- on the front lawn of the church
- on paved area between the Fellowship Hall and the Office Building

Jesus commands us to love our neighbor as ourselves. So it is important for us to protect each other in case someone is sick with COVID-19 but does not have symptoms and/or does not know that they're sick. So, people will be strongly encouraged to bring their own chairs and shade coverings from home to the outdoor spiritual gatherings. (However, some chairs will be available for those who don't bring chairs from home.) Face coverings will be required. Family groupings will be seated in ways to maintain social distancing between each family grouping. The church custodian will be on duty to disinfect the restrooms in the Fellowship Hall between uses.


Some have asked why the church doesn't move all the Sunday morning worship service outdoors. Right now the church does *not* have the ability to do an outdoor worship service online. The church needs to continue offering worship online for the many people who can only come online. Some are shut-ins. Others live too far away to come in person. And some are very reluctant to come to any kind of large gathering until there is a vaccine. So, church leadership believes that overall the best way is to continue online worship each Sunday while expanding our spiritual offerings to include outdoor Saturday events about once a month. Perhaps as we learn more about all the details involved in having an outdoor spiritual gathering, we can figure out the tech issues that would let us to effectively share such an outdoor service online.

Remember Those Who Have Gone Before on All Saints Sunday, November 1st

Sunday, November 1 is All Saints Sunday. During the service on November 1, we will remember our loved ones who have passed during the last year.

This year the service may take on special meaning since because of COVID-19 so many memorial services have been either postponed or restricted to a few family members. The Worship Committee is working on special ways for people to participate in the All Saints Sunday Service from their homes. Watch the weekly announcements and e-mails for further information. Or, you can call the church office for updates.

On All Saints Sunday, loved ones will be remembered in several ways:



- People connected to the church family who have died in the last year will be remembered during the service. This includes people who have moved away but were part of the church family for many years and people who have become connected with St.
 Matthew's through online worship. To make sure everyone is included, please let Louise Green in the church office know by phone 626-333-6656 or e-mail smumchh@gmail.com. It is especially helpful if folks will contact the church office with the names of those who may have moved away but have been part of the church family for many years.
- The church family is encouraged to share the names of loved ones regardless of their connection with St. Matthew's who have passed in the last year. The names of these loved ones will be shared during the service. Such loved ones might include family, friends, neighbors, people who have had an impact on your life If you would like to add the name of a loved one to be shared during the service, please contact Louise Green in the church office by phone 626-333-6656 or e-mail smumchh@gmail.com.
- During the service, there will be a time when people can remember in their hearts and/or homes the names of loved ones. You do not need to contact anyone in advance to share these names. The service will include a time when people may choose to either silently lift up people's names in their hearts or say the names of loved ones out loud in their homes. Some may only remember people who have died in the last year. Others may included loved ones who have died many years ago.



John Cobb Leads Discussion about Praying for Others on October 15th at 10:30 am

John Cobb, the author of *Praying for Jennifer*, is leading a special class about intercessory prayer – praying for others – on Thursday, October 15th at 10:30 am. Everyone is encouraged to come and take advantage of this unique opportunity to gain a better understanding about how praying for others works. John Cobb is absolutely convinced that praying for others is powerful and important even when we do not fully understand how such prayers work. But he also thinks that developing a clearer understanding of how intercessory prayer works can help us pray for others more effectively.

The class promises to be stimulating and enlightening. It is *not* necessary to read *Praying for Jennifer* in order to come. But, reading *Praying for Jennifer* may help deepen one's insights and understandings of the conversation. It is particularly helpful to read chapters 4, 5 and 6. You can get the book through the church office or by ordering online.

In addition to writing *Praying for Jennifer*, John Cobb has written more than 50 other books in a variety of areas including theology, philosophy and sustainable environmental development. At least one historian has described him as one of the two most important North American theologians of the twentieth century.

The class will meet by Zoom. One of the advantages of gathering by Zoom is that people can come to the study even if the person only has a landline phone. So, you don't need to have a computer or the internet to come.



The chairlift is to assist our members who have difficulties going up and down stairs in getting to the basement restrooms. The chairlift has been in the planning stages for well over a year. Once we identified a company to do the work, we realized that


the chairlift would work best in our sanctuary if two other projects were completed first.

Car Parade on Sunday, October 18th at 5:00pm

On Sunday evening October 18th, St. Matthew's is having another Car Parade.

We will visit several people connected with the church family.



The car parade will start forming in the parking lot at 4:45 pm. (note new time). Bring your car – decorated or not. For the most part, folks will stay in their own cars. If for some reason someone needs to get out of their car, the church family expects the person to practice social distancing and wear a face mask. While we're waiting to leave, some may wish to add last minute decorations to their cars. Then, at 5:00 pm (note new time) we'll set out to visit people. We'll do our best to caravan together. But, maps and addresses will be provided just in case. At each home, we'll drive by slowly to have lots of time to honk, wave, smile, . . . Usually around 3 families are visited. The whole parade lasts less than an hour.

As we continue to live with the pandemic, a number of people are feeling cut off or isolated. Car parades help in two different ways. First, the parade parade provides an opportunity for folks who are parading in their cars to get out and see one another as well as those being visited. Second, the people being visited enjoy having "company" drive past their homes.

The church's understanding of who to visit is changing. People we used to think of as "shutins" are coming to church online every Sunday. Others who used to be able to come regularly in person to worship are finding the technology so challenging that they are not able to worship online. And yet others are in situations where concerns for their well-being mean that they seldom leave their homes or even see anyone from a distance.

St. Matts hopes to have a car parade each month. If you have suggestions of people to visit, contact the church office or Olga Baker.



St. Matthew's Annual Charge Conference is Friday, November 20th at 3 pm

Charge Conference is our church's "annual meeting." This year our charge conference will be at 3 pm on Friday, November 20th with our district superintendent, Rev. Melissa Roux MacKinnon presiding.

Pastor Richard has been working with various church members and a playground inspector to ensure this project gets taken care of before the reopening of the preschool to ensure our students' safety. Preschool Playground Update

The overall plans for repairing the Preschool Play Structure are moving forward. Shortly before shutting down because of COVID-19, preschool leadership asked to have the Play Structure inspected to make sure it was safe for



young children. The resulting inspection highlighted several critical repairs needed to keep children safe.

Despite the shut-down, the trustees and preschool have continued to move forward in developing a plan to make these repairs. Thanks to people's generosity in the matching gift campaign last spring, it is expected that enough funds are available to make all the needed repairs. Dick Cline has carefully studied the inspection report and 80+ pages of guidelines to develop drawings for what needs to be done. Marilyn McMullin has been working with Los Angeles County to get the necessary permissions to widen the entire play ground by moving the curb and fence to narrow the alley. This change will create a critically needed safe fall zone around the Play Structure. Terry Feulner has contacted a variety of contractors about doing the work. And, many others have contributed other important pieces needed to help finalize the plans.

The church is waiting to hear if it has gotten final permission from LA County to move the curb and fence. This may be the last permission piece that's needed. But there have been so many unexpected developments, those coordinating the project would not be surprised if something else turns up. If all goes well, construction to make the necessary repairs could start by early next year.

The EIC (Engaging in Conversation) team wants to thank everyone who participated in the recent "Let's Talk About It" series of conversations. During this three-part series we came together to ask:

- How can racial tensions still be so prevalent?

- the disregard of the humanity of others (as in the relocation of Japanese Americans to internment camps during World War II),
- the tools of fear, class, policy, and profiling used to maintain the status quo, (as in a black repairman needing to explain his inventory, tools, receipts and being afraid to work at night),
- the ways racism is justified and deflected in daily conversations (as in references to black on black crime, stereotyping, media portrayals).

San Fernando Valley Refugee Children's Center

A few weeks ago, I wrote an article describing my visit to the San Fernando Valley Refugee Children's Center (Center). The Center is run and sponsored by our sister church, the North Hills United Methodist Church in the San Fernando/North Hills area. The Center offers hope, comfort and love to children seeking refuge from violence in their home country.

In that article I passed on the plea from Pastor Fred Morris for donations to the Center. During this period of Covid-19 the Center has struggled in their fundraising efforts



as events and traditional outreach have been hampered by the pandemic.

Let me tell you how the Center operates. It locates the families of those refugee children with known relatives in the Los Angeles area. Then, a representative from the Center travels to the location where the child is held, recovers the child and unites the child with a family member. It then offers them wrap-around services which include psychological evaluations and therapy due to trauma experienced during the trajectory or the violence experienced in their country of origin, or both. The costs for travel for the child and the Center's representative, processing fees charged by for-profit holding agencies, therapy, ongoing legal representation to assist the child in accessing status to remain in the country, and family-child transitioning help are costs paid by the Center. Some costs on a sliding scale, as can be afforded by the family, may be recovered. Unfortunately, these families are for the most part, working poor.

Thank you to the members that contributed to the Center a few months ago when the call for donations first went out via *The ParishScope*. Our congregation is known for its compassion and generosity in donating food, helping the homeless and through UMCOR reaching people around the world. Let's also do the same to help a neighboring sister church that has taken on a challenge worthy of our assistance. To add to the \$400 raised for such a great need, on Sunday, October 18th, the church will dedicate the day's offering to help the Center.


