A Big Thanks to St. Matthew's Church Family

Dear Church Family,

I want to take a minute to tell you how awesome St. Matthew's members are. We currently have over \$35,000 in our "Matching Gifts Fund." That means that you, St. Matthew's members, have given over \$20,000, matched by a gift of \$15,000 to fix the office roof and the preschool playground. Thank you to everyone who has given to these projects.

By the time you read this article, the office roof will have been replaced and we'll be ready to weather the winter storms this year.

We are still working on repairing the preschool playground equipment. We have a contractor ready to do the work but there are some details that have to be worked out. We hope to have the playground ready to go soon.

St. Matthew's Plans to Continue and Strengthen the Online Worship Service

Online worship will continue even when in person worship in the Sanctuary resumes. Many of the 300+ people who worship online each week at St. Matthew's will be unable to come to worship in person. People from as far away as Minnesota, Tennessee, Utah and Africa have left comments encouraging comments about the online worship service.

People want the online worship service to continue for a variety of reasons. Some are shut-ins who can only worship online. Others live so far away its impractical to come except perhaps for special occasions. Yet others sometimes travel so online worship allows them to come wherever in the world they happen to be.

Since St. Matthew's is going to continue offering online worship, it is beginning to invest in equipment to strengthen its online worship capabilities. The improvements in the July 5 worship service were made possible by recently purchased equipment. St. Matthew's has begun consulting with an audio/visual specialist who came highly recommended by other United Methodists. The consultant has made many practical, inexpensive suggestions over the past few weeks that have been very helpful. In addition, the consultant is working with church leadership to develop an overall plan what is needed in order to do online worship well. Once the plan is complete, there will be additional equipment purchases. This includes upgrading from the smart phone we're using right now to one (or possibly more) good camera(s). Sometimes it's been hard to find the needed equipment because so many churches started worshiping online at the same time.

Many thanks to our tech crew – Morgan Matthews, Ruth Hutchison and Jack Weatherford with help from many others – for providing the foundations that make online worship possible each week.

What are the Plans for In Person Worship to Resume in the Sanctuary?

St. Matthew's is exploring how to resume in person worship while continuing to offer online worship. Some in the church family long to gather together for worship as soon as possible. Others do not yet feel safe in group gatherings. And, some have family who don't want them to leave the house for anything.

In addition to the congregation's differing viewpoints, there is Jesus' commandment to love our neighbor as ourselves. Since some people are sick with COVID-19 and infecting others without any signs of illness, loving our neighbor as ourself requires worshiping and gathering in ways that protect people from being infected by someone who doesn't know they are sick. The Church Council has established a task force to develop a plan to help do this. Members of the task force are Olga Baker, Mike Gallagher, Bob Hernandez, Marilyn Matthews, Sherry Morales, Elaine Ono and Pastor Richard. Please pray for them as they wrestle with developing this plan.

As part of developing this plan, the church is mailing a letter to everyone in the church family. The letter includes a questionnaire for people to return to the church. The questionnaire provides everyone in the church family an opportunity to share their views and help church leadership better understand people's needs.

Once a plan to resume in person worship is developed, it will need to be approved by groups within our church and also by our district superintendent. So, it may be a while before in person worship resumes.

Whatever St. Matthew's does next, we will need to offer worship in ways that meet the differing needs of our church family.

Board of Trustees Decides All Groups Meeting at Church Need to Wear Face Coverings

Jesus commands us to love our neighbor as ourselves. Some people who are sick with COVID-19 do not show any signs of illness. Because they are sick, they can infect others without anyone being aware this is happening. So, loving our neighbor as ourself requires gathering in ways that protect one another from being infected by someone who doesn't know they are sick.

Wearing a face covering in case you are sick but don't know is one of the most effective ways to keep others from becoming infected. One of the primary ways that COVID-19 spreads from one person to another is through droplets that sick people breathe out which then float in the air. Wearing a face covering keeps a sick person from putting these droplets into the air where they can infect others. Wearing a face covering is *not* about keeping the person wearing it safe from others, but about protecting others in case the person wearing it is sick but doesn't know it.

During its July meeting, the Board of Trustees discussed what a group meeting on the St. Matthew's campus needs to do in order to resume an person gathering. It is working with the Church Council in the overall development of these plans. For the time being – especially with the present increase in infections – it does not encourage any in person meetings.

During the board's discussion, it became clear how important it is to wear face covering in order to protect others. So, the Board of Trustees voted to require that any plan which allows people to meet together in person needs to include wearing face coverings. All groups – including fellowship and study groups – are asked to follow this requirement.

In addition, as in person gatherings are allowed to resume, the Trustees encourage groups to meet outside on the church's beautiful grounds whenever possible. For a variety of reasons, outside gatherings are safer than inside gatherings.



St. Matthew's Chancel Choir and Carillon Ringers have been "getting together" via ZOOM conferencing. We get together on Thursdays as we usually do when we are rehearsing for Sunday Worship.
