Stewardship Campaign Update

As we continue to wear masks, wash our hands and keep a safe distance from each other, the number of Covid 19 cases are reported to be going down

so it's just a matter of time until we can all attend worship again. I am so looking forward to that time.

I want to bring you up to date on our 2021 Stewardship Campaign. So far this year we have 35 pledges in 2021 compared to 47 last year. 3 of the 35 pledges are from people that did not pledge last year.

Helping Protect One Another during In Person Worship

It is encouraging that Los Angeles County is now in the Orange Tier and that more and move people have been able to get vaccinated. Even so, some people are still getting sick and needing to be hospitalized. And, it is important to continue being careful so that our area does not join many other parts of the country in having another COVID-19 spike.

Because St. Matthew's is trying to follow Jesus' commandment to love your neighbor as yourself, we will be doing the following at the "in person" outdoor to help protect people in case someone is sick but doesn't know it:

- Bringing your own chair. The church will have some chairs in case you're unable to do this.
- Coming to a check-in station, where we will note your presence and check your temperature with a laser thermometer.
- If the day is sunny, you might want an umbrella, but this is up to you.
- Setting up your chair at properly spaced markings on the lawn to put your chair. Family groups can set up their chairs together around the same marking.
- Wearing face coverings
- Maintaining social distancing of 6 feet or more
- Because singing makes it so much easier to spread the virus, there will not be any congregational singing. There may be special music by an appropriately distanced soloist.
- not serving food or drink
- being encouraged to refrain from shaking hands or hugging

The Board of Trustees Reports . . .

Dear Members of St. Matthew's UMC,

Some of you have had questions about the work going on at the preschool, and other campus projects. I am



writing this to let you know of some of the things that your Trustees have been working on, and why.

- 1) Due to improperly installed play equipment at the Preschool, much time, effort and monies were put forth to ensure the Preschool play yard meets California State Safety requirements for children. This required taking it apart and rearranging it so that if a child falls from it, they will land on newly installed soft material. This was all extremely time consuming, and required hiring a professional contractor. If you happen to be in the church area, you might want to drive down and look at it now, as it really looks great!
- 2) Our own Huber Bongolan spends many hours on our church campus, arriving early to pick up the many bottles, cans, and other trash left in the parking lot and behind bushes. Due to neighborhood or homeless persons bringing furniture, bedding, and other unwanted possessions, stuffing the bins, and leaving little room for our own church's yard trimmings and other waste, our church's big trash bins have had locks put on them.
- 3) Huber also has been in charge of helping beautify our church by having Boy Scouts do community service projects and Eagle Scout Projects. They have trimmed, weeded, and put new mulch in areas to enhance the plants growing there, including the Aney Garden. Another project included pouring cement to extend the basketball court to actual full size. If you should see the scouts and their supportive families working at the church, please acknowledge them, and let them know how much we appreciate their many efforts and projects.
- 4) There have been persons roaming the church campus at night, as seen on the cameras. installed by Pastor Joshua and the Blessed Chinese congregation. Their pastor saw some of these people trying door knobs, in apparent attempts to get in. At least one of these persons jimmied the door open to the Youth Room, and had been sleeping there.

Your Board of Trustees sees that the neighborhood has been changing, and, for the safety of the three congregations who meet on our campus, and the safety of our Office Administrator during work hours, we are looking into various ways to maintain our campus safety without having someone living on campus. (A security service, additional alarms, or perhaps a nice wrought iron fence, as seen at other nearby churches.)

If you have an idea, please inform one of the Trustees, so that we can make a plan to ensure the safety of all on St. Matthew's campus.

With an intimate sultry voice and Latin infused playing style, Alexis Soto Jr's music draws

His current project is his first ever full length album that will dive into our current day human experience and explore topics of love, joy, gratitude, hope, grief, death, mental health, anxiety, addiction, God, and spirituality.




4 Ways to Give to St. Matthew's


