
Pentecost Sunday is May 23rd

Worship at St. Matthew's



St. Matthew's has both outdoor and online worship each Sunday.

9:00 am in person on the front lawn of the church 11:00 am (no longer 9:55) online.

The services will be similar, but also different. Both services will have the same sermon by Pastor Richard. The 9 am outdoor service will have special music coordinated by Cindy Fallgren. The prayer time will include praying for people by name. But, it will *not* have any congregational singing or prayers for people to say out loud.

The 11 am online service will continue to be like the service which has developed over the last year. It will include special music from a wide variety of groups and people. People will be encouraged to sing and say prayers at home out loud.



Moving Towards Reopening In Person Worship in the Sanctuary

In the last few weeks there has been lots of good news about COVID-19. California is planning a significant state-wide reopening on June 15. Meanwhile, infection rates in Los Angeles County continue to decline. It is possible our county may

move up into the yellow tier – the least restrictive tier – even before June 15. And, the CDC recently announced significantly reduced restrictions for people who have been fully vaccinated, especially outdoors. Even so, face coverings continue to be recommended in many indoor situations with larger groups of people such as worship.

Resuming in person indoor worship will soon be possible. But, there will still be differences from the way worship was conducted before COVID-19. The church's Task Force on Resuming In Person Worship is meeting and working on a reopening plan. As part of this, the task force is trying to keep up with recommended best practices in a rapidly changing environment. Its work has also been helped by the information that came back from the recent worship survey. The task force is strongly leaning towards a more careful reopening in mid-June. And then loosening the guidelines as the situation continues to improve. It is concerned what has happened several times with COVID-19 spikes developing when places rushed too quickly to fully reopen.

Once a plan is developed, it will need to be reviewed and approved by the district before worship can reopen. So, the date and details have not been finalized as this *ParishScope* goes to press.

Continuing the online service is part of the reopening plan. Many have found that the online worship offers a way to still come to church when they are shut-in, not feeling well, traveling, . . . And even with all the good COVID-19 news, a significant number of people in the church family remain wary about returning to in person worship. So, the church's tech crew is working with the task force on how to have both in person and online worship.

Members of the Task Force on Resuming In Person Worship are Mike Gallahger, Olga Baker, Bob Hernandez, Elaine Ono, Rodney Kurimoto, Marilyn Matthews, Morgan Matthews and Pastor Richard. Jack Weatherford and the rest of the tech crew are working with the task force.

Thank you for your prayers and patience as the task force does its work.

Stewardship 2021 Pledge Campaign

THANK YOU, St. Matthew's, for your faithful support of St Matthew's through your pledges. The total amount of pledges and giving are expected to remain pretty much the same as last year. Helping Protect One Another during In Person Worship

It is encouraging that Los Angeles County is now in the Orange Tier and that more and move people have been able to get vaccinated. Even so, some people are still getting sick and needing to be hospitalized. And, it is important to continue being careful so that our area does not join many other parts of the country in having another COVID-19 spike.

Because St. Matthew's is trying to follow Jesus' commandment to love your neighbor as yourself, we will be doing the following at the "in person" outdoor to help protect people in case someone is sick but doesn't know it:

- Bringing your own chair. The church will have some chairs in case you're unable to do this.
- Coming to a check-in station, where we will note your presence and check your temperature with a laser thermometer.
- If the day is sunny, you might want an umbrella, but this is up to you.
- Setting up your chair at properly spaced markings on the lawn to put your chair. Family groups can set up their chairs together around the same marking.
- Wearing face coverings
- Maintaining social distancing of 6 feet or more
- Because singing makes it so much easier to spread the virus, there will not be any congregational singing. There may be special music by an appropriately distanced soloist.
- not serving food or drink
- being encouraged to refrain from shaking hands or hugging



Preschool Lease Approved in Special Charge Conference on April 8

On Thursday evening, April 8 St. Matthew's had a special charge conference with our district superintendent Rev. Melissa MacKinnon presiding. The charge conference reviewed several suggested

improvements to the lease with Blessings Day Care. After a time for questions and discussion, the updated lease was approved without any votes in opposition.

However, the lease is still waiting for final East District approval before Blessing Day Care can begin operations at St. Matthew's. Over a month ago, the Preschool Advisory Board provided lengthy written answers to several questions it had received from the East District Committee on Building and Locations. Neither the Preschool Advisory Board nor the special charge conference thought any additional changes to the lease were necessary in order to respond to these questions. The Preschool Advisory Board continues actively following up with the East District about getting its approval for the lease.

Once the East District approves the lease, Blessings Day Care is ready to begin operations at St. Matthew's. It will need to have the Education Building relicensed under its name. So even with East District approval, it will still be several months before children are back at the preschool.


