Video Producer For Weekly Sunday Worship Service Needed

Do you have a child, grandchild, niece, nephew, friend, neighbor, . . . that is looking for a paid part-time position who could do this job well?

You will lead a small team live streaming a weekly Sunday morning worship service for St. Matthew's United Methodist Church in Hacienda Heights, California. Other team members staff the sound system and non-remote control camera(s). In addition to leading the team, your role is combining worship slides made by church office, occasional pre-recorded videos by others, and several different camera inputs to live stream the worship service to Facebook using OBS (Open Broadcasting System) operating on a PC. Afterwards, you edit the live streamed worship service into a 30-35 minute "highlights" service for permanent posting on Facebook/YouTube. Video editing may be done on the software of your choice using either a PC or Mac.

Estimated 5-6 hours a week including prep work and post production editing. Must be present at the church on Sunday morning for the service. But prep and post production work may be done from home. This is a paid position with the church, at least \$150/week.

Filling this position is essential if St. Matthew's is going to be able to continue to have a strong, ongoing online worship presence. The volunteer who has led this effort for the last year woull like to retire from the role. Because of the demands of the position, there does not appear to be anyone else who can do this on a regular weekly basis as a volunteer. So the SPRC and Church Council authorized the creation of this position.

Important Ins And Outs Of Using The Sanctuary For In-Person Worship

Although we have returned to in person worship in the sanctuary, there are some differences. The congregation continues to be guided by Jesus' commandment to love your neighbor as yourself. So it tries to protect people in case someone has COVID-19, but doesn't know it. And, the Church Council has affirmed it is wiser to go more slowly, erring on the side of caution since there are not "do overs" if someone gets sick.

Because St. Matthew's has taken this so seriously, many of the revised guidelines for the "Delta Variant" are things we are already doing to protect everyone in worship – especially those who may not have been vaccinated or have special risks. To wisely and safely continue indoor inperson worship services, the church family continues to follow these guidelines:

- We are able to sing. But only because everyone is wearing face coverings!! Face coverings
 are important because when people sing they send out droplets for long distances –
 well over the usual 6 feet of social distancing. Droplets are the most common way
 COVID-19 is spread.
- It is important to wear face coverings and maintain social distancing between family groups.
- People sit in "every other pew" with X's in the pew marking where a family group or individual may sit. Every family grouping has direct access to an aisle. (I.e. so you won't need to go past another family grouping to get in or out of the pew.) Since we are using every other pew, the hymnals, bibles and offering envelops have been left in the pew racks.
- People enter and leave through the front door of the church. An usher can open the side
 door for those needing to use the ramp from the parking lot. There is a check in station
 near the entrance to record names in case people need to be contacted later.
 Temperature checks are no longer needed.
- Face coverings and hand sanitizer are available at the check in station.
- Part of the sanctuary is designed as only for those who have been vaccinated in order to provide additional protection for those who are most vulnerable. The vaccinated only section has blue X's marking where to sit. Seating for everyone has green X's.
- Only one family grouping or individual is able to go into a restroom at a time. People are asked to disinfect the restroom after they use it. Since space is very tight downstairs, people are waiting in the narthex until it is their turn.
- The new chair lift is available to assist people going up and down the stairs. It is disinfected between uses.
- The area in the back of the sanctuary with a rocking chair and table will continue to be available to families with young children. It will be sanitized between uses and families are strongly encouraged to bring their own paper, crayons, etc.
- No food is served after church.
- Offering plates are available in the entry ways for people to leave their offering. However, the plates will not be passed during the service.

St. Matthew's The Board Of Trustees Reports . . .

Board of Trustees Letter - August 2021 Dear Congregation,

Many of you noticed that the concrete slabs surrounding the main sanctuary have been shaved down, so that our congregation no longer trips or gets stuck, even



going up and down the ADA ramp. Daniel Zoubstov of Troop 730 completed this as his Eagle Project. Due to the COVID virus, he wasn't permitted to have his fellow scouts help with this, but he did have his parents, and a professional to do the work. As was mentioned in the church service two weeks ago, this was an expensive project, and Daniel would be grateful for any help to finish paying off this contractor. Just indicate on your payment, that it is for the Boy Scout Eagle Project to shave down the sidewalk surrounding the main sanctuary. It makes a huge difference for those who come with walkers and wheelchairs.

Another Scout proposed to build a canopy /trellis on the North side of Dodrill Hall, as a shaded area near the basketball court. His father, a licensed contractor, will be doing the bulk of the work, following the purchase of materials, etc.

Other scouts have been weeding, trimming, and pruning plants, laying out new mulch, and giving our campus a much needed facelift.

The Boy Scouts are now sponsored by the Kiwanis Club, and all have insurance through the Boy Scout Council.

Have you noticed the sign along Newton promoting the new Blessings Preschool? Tina has been working tirelessly getting it ready for students. The preschool toilets are being installed at Blessings Preschool.

Marilyn McMullin worked to get the new toilet installed in the office. Hooray! Keep our Trustees in prayer!
