

St. Matthew's Is Planning for In-Person Worship on Ash Wednesday, March 2.

St. Matthew's hopes to have its Ash Wednesday service in-person in the Sanctuary at 5:30 pm on Wednesday, March 2. It will be a very simple service lasting less than an hour. There will be lots of contemplative music and time for quiet reflection. Because of the unusual time for the service, it is unclear if this service can also be offered online.

Traditionally, the Ash Wednesday service includes an opportunity for people to have ashes put on their forehead. In order to keep people safe, this year this will be done differently. Just as we do with communion, people are encouraged to bring something from home. Possibilities bringing oil (often olive oil but it could be any cooking oil), dirt from your garden, an erasable black sharpie (could be a different color), water in which to dip your finger, ashes you make by burning something, Then at the appropriate place in the service you can put these "ashes' on your forehead or hand.

Ash Wednesday marks the beginning of Lent, the season of spiritual preparation for Easter. Lent is 40 days long because Jesus spent 40 days in the wilderness at the beginning of his ministry (see Matthew 4:1-11). Traditionally, Lent has been a solemn season seeking to deepen our relationship with God through prayer, self-examination, self-denial, and studying God's Word.

Those who look closely at the calendar may say, "But there are 46 days from Ash Wednesday to Easter!" That's because the Sundays during Lent are *not* part of Lent. The early Christian movement saw every Sunday as a "little" Easter Sunday. From their perspective, the celebration of Easter is always stronger than the solemness and fasting of Lent. So, the Sundays during Lent are not counted as part of the Lenten season. Even during Lent, Sunday remains a day of celebration.


St. Matthew's Assists with Recovery Work in Tonga

Worshipping at St. Matthew's



Thankfully, the spike from the omicron variant appears to be subsiding. Groups at St. Matthew's that had paused in-person meetings are beginning to meet inperson again.

St. Matthew's Task Force on Resuming Worship had an e-mail consultation. It strongly recommends for the time being that the church keeps its present practices regarding Sunday worship since so many in the church family are vulnerable. Indeed, even though the spike is subsiding, folks connected with St. Matthew's still are testing positive and needing to isolate. Sometimes people are not only testing positive but getting sick or even needing to be hospitalized.

So, for the time-being as part of following Jesus' commandment to love our neighbor as ourselves, the church family is asked to:

- If you are sick (COVID-19 or otherwise) or had significant exposure to someone with COVID-19 in the last 5 days, stay home and only come to worship online.
- Wear a face covering at all times during worship, especially when singing.
- Be careful to maintain social distancing. Several months ago when things were looking better, there was a tendency to be more relaxed about this.

The Task Force continues to monitor the situation and will meet as necessary. Task Force members are: Olga Baker, Richard Bentley, Mike Gallagher, Bob Hernandez, Rodney Kurimoto, Marilyn Matthews and Elaine Ono.

St. Matthew's broke even financially in 2021, as a result of strong giving during December and Christmas. Financial highlights of the year include the funding and installation of the new audio/video equipment in the

sanctuary, upgrading the preschool play area and generous contributions to UMCOR.

In 2022 Blessings Preschool has begun operation and we are expanding our relationship with Blessed Chinese to include an afterschool program. Both the preschool and afterschool programs will provide a service to the community as well as provide income to St. Matthew's.

A balanced budget has been approved by the committee incorporating the direction provided at the last Church Council meeting. The final budget will be presented at the next Church Council meeting for formal approval. A huge thank you to Patty Graves, our treasurer, for all of her work putting the budget together and help the new chairs come up to speed.


