The United Methodist movement has a powerful, distinctive emphasis on grace and how it shapes and guides us in living a rich, full Christian life. Grace can be seen as God's life-giving, life-changing love. From a United Methodist perspective, grace is undivided but is often experienced in 3 different ways. The Lenten Study Class spend a week focusing on each of these 3 ways:

- March 17 Prevenient Grace or the ways that God is at work in every human heart.
- March 24 Saving Grace, Justification and Assurance or the way God forgives us and restores us to God's favor.
- March 31 Sanctifying Grace or the ways in which we are invited to grow so that all that we say, think, and/or do is guided by love.

There is no book for the Lenten Study. But each week there will be a brief study guide. It will be available in the Sanctuary the Sunday before each class. Or, you can have it e-mailed to you each week by contacting the church office by e-mail office@smumchh.org or phone (626) 261-1428.

- Global Migration



Stewardship Is

Steardship – Its Not About The Money

This year we are going to try and look at Stewardship in a new way. We will remember the legacy of those who came before us and that we,



too, will leave a legacy for the future. We are placeholders and caretakers of God's energy. We will leave things better than we found them and look at the world the way God sees it, feed the hungry, bind the wounds, and care for the needy through generous-hearted living.

We spent last month reviewing the story of *It's a Wonderful Life* and dissecting the characters and relationships therein. How does this story relate to Stewardship? Who are the good stewards in the story, and who fails to be one? Notice that stewardship in this story has almost nothing to do with giving or asking for money. George Bailey never asks for money; he never even asks for help. He is arguably the most generous character we see, but he is not financially well off. He lives in a drafty run-down house that his wife pieces together as she is able. We never see Mary Bailey complain about anything. She is generous and kind to everyone. She does not envy those who are more comfortable than her family. She is joyful and gracious when others succeed. Would she lust after her friend's new car or feel superior because she gave the honeymoon fund to help the Building & Loan? I think Not. And God knows that George's discouragement is not a money problem - it would be easy to shower \$8,000 on George, but that is not the problem. The problem is that George is discouraged. Despite everything he does he seems to always face a wall of problems. Like Job, his generosity, kindness, selflessness and sacrifice does not mean tomorrow will not contain a new challenge.

The story is actually not about money, but about how people in a community relate to, acknowledge, and care for one another. Money is the tool used to create tension in the plot, but the theme of the story is about how we make a difference in one another's lives.

So, this year we will focus on our relationships; and specifically on our ability to be in a trusting relationship with God, instead of on the church's need to pay the bills. Given the last two pandemic years it seems timely to bless one-another's gifts and lift up one-another's needs. With the hope that by focusing on our trust and love for God, each other and the world at large, St Matthew's will stand as an exemplary Steward of God's blessings. Throughout his teaching Jesus repeatedly reminds us that we need not worry, that God's provision is sufficient. His Stewards in the New Testament (disciples and saints) continue to return us to that reality: our lives have meaning not in what we have, but in what we do for God.
