During the service, candles will be extinguished as the sanctuary is gradually darkened. The congregation will help by singing hymns that are connected with the readings.



Celebrate Hope!! Christ Is Alive!! Easter Sunday, April 17th

Invite family, friends, neighbors and/or folks you know to come celebrate this Easter at St. Matthew's. Folks can come at 10 am for either the in-person in the Sanctuary or the online as the service is happening in the Sactuary. People may also connect with the Easter service online later on Easter Sunday or throughout the week.

This Easter includes many of St. Matthew's cherished traditions:

 Bringing flowers to help cover the Easter cross. The cross will be on the lawn in front of the church before the 10 am service. Everyone is encouraged to bring flowers from home to help cover the cross.



• Amazing, uplifting special music from both the Chancel Choir and the Bell Choir. In the Moravian Easter tradition, there will also be special trombone music.

• Opportunities for the congregation to sing lots of Easter hymns.

As things presently stand, face coverings will be optional on the main floor. But, the balcony is reserved for those who wish to worship in an area where everyone is wearing face coverings.

Easter Flower Cross

One of the enduring traditions at St. Matthew's is covering the Easter Cross with flowers. This year options include:

- placing flowers on the Easter Cross before the 10 am service.
 Bring flowers from home to help cover the cross.
- during the online service, place a flower from the yard in a vase, perhaps with a cross nearby. Or, get a colorful bouquet or Easter Lily to put in a special place. Or, . . .
- drive by St. Matthew's later on Easter to add flowers to the Easter Cross on the church's front lawn.





Sunday, April 26th (Sunday after Easter) the 10 am Service will be Online Only

The Annual Conference is providing the Worship Service for St. Matthew's at 10:00 am on Sunday, April 26th. It will be brief, about 35 minutes with special music from across the annual conference.

By only having a 10 am service online, the entire worship team – musicians, tech crew, ushers, greeters – can have a much deserved rest after all the special preparations for Palm Sunday, Good Friday and Easter.

Those who desire in-person worship on April 26th can come to the 8 am service in the Sanctuary. It is a more informal service and offers the opportunity to discuss the sermon with Pastor Richard. It often has special music by Cindy Fallgren and/or Johnny Doyle.

Giving Easter "Baskets" to Local Families



The week before Easter, St. Matthew's is giving a total of 50 Easter "Baskets" – \$50 gift cards for food – to Kwis and Newton Schools to help children and their families have a special Easter. Sunday, May 1st – Joint Worship Service



St. Matthew's and Blessed Chinese are having a joint in-person worship service at 10 am on Sunday, May 1st outdoors on the lawn in front of the Sanctuary. The service will also be shared live online on Facebook.

The service is an opportunity for many of the different groups at St. Matthew's to say farewell to Pastor Richard. In addition to Blessed Chinese, folks may be present from Blessings Preschool, Cub Pack 710, Scout Troop 710, the Chinese after school program, and Hacienda Korean. May 1st begins with a brief worship

service. This service includes special music from several different groups and a meditation by Monalisa Tu'itahi, wife of our district superintendent and the first elected lay delegate from our annual conference to General Conference. At the end ot f the service there will be an opportunity for different groups to share short farewell messages with Pastor Richard.

Since it is a joint service, all of the different groups will share in leading the overall service. Parts of the service may happen in different languages. But only one language will be used at a time with verbal translation kept to a minimum. There will also be a time for everyone to partake in communion using communion elements they have brought from home or individualized communion packets provided by the church. (I.e. communion will be like its been done since the beginning ot COVID.)

This joint service is in addition to Pastor Richard's farewell party/40 years of ministry celebration from 1 pm to 4:30 pm on Saturday, May 14. Pastor Richard's last service at St. Matthew's is Sunday, May 15 and includes Pastor Richard's final sermon before retiring.

And, while expenses are \$6,400 greater than last year, they are right on target to budgeted amounts. Our overall net income (loss) is improved by \$6,500. Another indicator of improvement is the available cash which is almost \$27,000 more than last year.

St. Matthew's is taking up a special UMCOR Offering for humanitarian relief efforts that are under way as a result of Russia's invasion of Ukraine. The funds will enable United Methodists and mission partners to provide support in Ukraine and in neighboring countries welcoming those fleeing the violence. So far more than \$6,000 has been given.

Because the United Methodist Church has congregations all around the globe, some of the UMCOR's relief work is being carried



out by local United Methodist Churches in European countries that border Ukraine. For example, in Romania the Cluj-Napoca United Methodist Church is using its community center, a former hotel, to host "guests" who had to flee Ukraine.

Updated Worship Protocals

Starting April 3, some changes were made in some of St. Matthew's worship practices:

 Balcony - The balcony has been reopened for occupancy during worship. Masks are required in the balcony.



- *Rest of sanctuary* Masks are optional.
- The first two pews on the piano side of the sanctuary are to be left empty.

Although masks will be optional in the sanctuary, people are asked to continue keeping a safe distance, at least 6 feet, between themselves and persons who are not part of their household.

For the time being, people are still asked to check in at the table in the entryway to the church. And, we will continue with the standing in place greeting at the beginning or worship and with people giving their offering at the back of the church as they enter or leave the sanctuary.

An Eastertime Thought from Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr.

Every year during the Lenten Season, members at a United Methodist Church in Orange County put together a Lenten Booklet. Members submit whatever their heart desires having to do with Lent for each of the 40 days in Lent. The booklet is copied and handed out free to anyone wishing a copy.

The submission below is from this year's booklet. Boy, this writing gave me something to really, really ponder.

<u>What the Cross Symbolizes</u>

by Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. (from "The Stone that Rolled Away – Living the Miracle of Easter")

Every time I look at the cross, I am reminded of the greatness of God and the redemptive power of Jesus Christ. I am reminded of the beauty of sacrificial love and the majesty of unswerving devotion to truth. It causes me to say with John Bowring:

> In the cross of Christ I glory, Towering o'er the wrecks of time; All the light of sacred story Gathers round its head sublime.

It would be wonderful were I to look at the cross and sense only such a sublime reaction. But somehow I can never turn my eyes from that cross without also realizing that it symbolizes a strange mixture of greatness and smallness, of good and evil. As I behold that uplifted cross, I am reminded not only of the unlimited power of God, but also of the sordid weakness of man. I think not only of the radiance of the divine, but also of the tang of the human. I am reminded not only of Christ at his best, but of man at his worst.

We must see the cross as the magnificent symbol of love conquering hate and of light overcoming darkness. But in the midst of this glowing affirmation, let us never forget that our Lord and Master was nailed to that cross because of human blindness. Those who crucified him knew not what they did.
