Music Ministry At St. Matthew's UMC

Dear St. Matthew's UMC Family,

Music has the power to bring people together, regardless of race, language, or culture. I emphasize the music ministry because I know its power and effectiveness. Music is an important part of my ministry.

I have been doing a music ministry for more than 25 years. I have taught many people how to play the guitar, keyboard, and drums. Of course, I also have provided vocal lessons. I've provided free music classes in all the churches I've served in the past, and those churches have received many new members and more than doubled. Bishop Grant Hagiya, Cabinet Members, and many UMC leaders know my music ministry and acknowledge its effectiveness.

Mary and I are about to start our music ministry at St. Matthew's UMC. We call it Free Music Lessons. When we have students, we make four student bands (Band A, B, C, & D). There are about 5-7 people in each band, including singers. Each band will take turns attending our church Sunday service and perform one song during the service. (Band A: 1st Sunday, Band B: 2nd Sunday, Band C: 3rd Sunday, Band D: 4th Sunday).

When students perform, their parents, grandparents, family members, relatives, and friends will come to our church. They will attend our Sunday worship. After the service, our church members will greet, meet, and have conversations with them. When they come to our church often and become familiar with the church members, some of their families will attend our worship every Sunday

regardless of their children's performance schedule. And they will register as members of our church. I've seen this a lot.

When the Free Music Lessons begin at our church, the Children, Youth, and Young Adult Ministries will soon start. You will see many young people at our church on Sundays and during the weekdays. Students' Parents will also serve the church as volunteer teachers for the Sunday schools.

We will first advertise our Free Music Lessons. We'll put a big banner from top to bottom on our church sanctuary building. People will look at our banner, call our church office, and pick up applications. We will also advertise our Free Music Lessons 24/7 through our church LED Sign Board. Our SPRC, Board of Trustees, and Finance agreed that we will put a big banner on the church sanctuary building.

Below is a large Free Music Lessons banner (W: 26ft, H: 13 ft) attached to the Hesperia United Methodist Church. The church has taken over my ministry and continues to provide music lessons to the community. When students apply, Mary and I will interview each student. We will choose about 30 students as we discern and pray to God.

As we begin our Free Music Lessons, I ask you to support our Free Music Lessons financially. I had a meeting with the finance committee members last week, and they actively agreed that I would send you this letter. I will send this letter to members who don't have their email addresses.

In order to run our Free Music Lessons, we will need to purchase some instruments, equipment, and accessories only once for the performance during Sunday's service. We will never provide musical instruments to students. All participants must have their own instruments because they need to practice at their homes during the weekdays. Students' instruments are in different conditions. Some instruments have good conditions, but others do not. Our church needs to provide instruments in very good condition for their performances at the church. They will use our instruments when they perform. It is also good for us to control their sounds when we have our own instruments and band system.

I submitted a purchase list to the Finance committee last week. Our budget for this purchase is **\$5,000 dollars**. I will submit all receipts of the purchase to the church to make everything clear. There will be no more extra expenditures after we purchase these instruments. Mary and I plan to begin our Free Music Lessons by the end of August. Hopefully, we could receive enough donations from our church members before we start our lessons.

I'd like to sincerely ask you to support this purchase. I'd like to ask you to give generous special donations to the church for Free Music Lessons. **You can designate your donations to Free Music Lessons.** Thank you so much for your prayers, support, and cooperation.

Help Needed For Sunday Worship Services

AUDIO/VIDEO PRODUCER for WEEKLY SUNDAY WORSHIP SERVICE (PART-TIME)



You will lead a small team live streaming a weekly Sunday morning worship service for St. Matthew's United Methodist Church in Hacienda Heights, California. Other team members staff the

sound system and the microphones. In addition to leading the team, your role is to insert worship slides made by church office, occasional pre-recorded videos (music), several camera inputs, and several microphone inputs into a live stream of the worship service to uploaded to Facebook/You Tube using OBS (Open Broadcasting System) operating on a PC. Afterwards, you will edit the live-streamed worship service into a 30-35 minute "highlights" service for permanent posting on Facebook/YouTube. Video editing may be done on the software of your choice using either a PC or Mac.

Estimated 5-6 hours a week including prep work and postproduction editing. Must be present at the church on Sunday morning beginning at 9 am to set up for the service and stay until all A/V equipment has been secured after the service, normally by 12 noon. Both prep and postproduction work may be done from home. Occasionally, there may be additional hours for special events and/or training volunteers to use the sound system as subs or for special events.

AUDIO PRODUCTION TECHNICIAN for WEEKLY SUNDAY WORSHIP SERVICE (PART-TIME)



You will be part of a small tech team providing for both live in person worship in the church's Sanctuary and the sharing of the service online for St. Matthew's United Methodist Church in Hacienda Heights, California. Your role is to manage all aspects of the newly installed audio system with up to 8 microphones feeding a live stream

digital mixer to produce optimal sound quality for both in person and online broadcast of Sunday Morning Church Services. Others on the team manage the video content including slides, cameras, pre-recorded videos and putting audio and video together using OBS (Open Broadcast System).

Estimated 3 hours a week including prep work on Sunday. Must be present at the church on Sunday morning beginning at 9 am to set up for the service and stay until all audio equipment has been secured after the service, normally by 12 noon. Occasionally, there may be additional hours for special events and/or training volunteers to use the sound system as subs or for special events.

One of this year's recipients was Patricia (Patti) Coots, wife of one of our former Pastors, Fred Coots.


